

US exceptionalism, particularly in technology, which drove such meaningful outperformance over the course of the past two calendar years, was undermined in mid-January by the revelation that a Chinese company, **Deepseek**, had developed an AI model at a fraction of the cost of its US counterparts, without compromising performance in any meaningful way.

This discovery brought into question the potential return on massive capital expenditure directed at developing large language models by US *hyperscalers* and the compute power requirements, which have driven the demand for semiconductor chips, notably those produced by **Nvidia**.

The Nasdaq Composite Index declined 10.3% in the quarter, while US midcaps, represented by the Russell 2000 Index lost 9.5%.

Further undermining US assets was the tariff rhetoric emanating from the White House, which would reap yet more damage post quarter-end. The **US dollar** lost 4% on a trade weighted basis during the quarter, with further weakness in April, taking year-to-date losses for the *Greenback* to over 6%.

European equities, along with typically defensive sectors, were the standout performers in the quarter. The **Stoxx Europe 600 Index** gained 10.7% while the **MSCI World Cyclicals** lost 15% relative to **Defensives.** The **MSCI All Country World Health Care** and **Consumer Staples** indices gained 5.1% and 5.8% respectively, while **IT** and **Consumer Discretionary** shed 11.6% and 7.5% respectively.

The yield on **US Treasuries,** which had risen steadily through the back end of 2024, peaked at 4.8% before posting a sharp rally as policy uncertainty and concerns over global growth took hold. Yields would fall further still in April as details of President Trump's new tariff policy emerged, before spiking as the inflationary impact of the level of tariff's became apparent.

Amidst this volatility, the **Vunani Global Equity Fund (Class C)** declined 1.14% net of fees during the quarter, while the Fund's benchmark, declined 1.79%. The Fund's more defensive positioning, along with an adherence to a strict valuation discipline, meant we were able to claw back some of the previous year's underperformance.

Measured gross of fees, the negative attribution from not owning **Nvidia**, which undermined much of the previous year's relative return, turned to a positive, with **Nvdia** contributing 54bps to the performance relative to benchmark. So too, our lack of exposure to **Tesla**, which itself added 57bps to relative performance, supplemented by strong contributions from **Visa** (+58bps), **Medtronic** (+47bps) and **Reckitt Benckiser** (+43bps).

Against this, some of the Fund's exposure to growth, technology and consumer discretionary companies, weighed on performance, notably **Novo Nordisk** (-61bps), **Adobe** (-38bps) and **Intercontinental Hotel Group** (-34bps).

The volatility and return dispersion in the quarter offered the opportunity to meaningfully improve the fund's aggregate discount to intrinsic value. We exited holdings in **RTX Corporation, Nestle, Estee Lauder, Essilor Luxxotica** and **Kakaku** and opened new positions in **L'Oreal** and **Shin-Etsu Chemical Corporation.**
